Why is emotional awareness important for children?

Children who are able to identify how they feel are often better able to communicate their needs. They are also more likely to understand the feelings of their friends, classmates, and the grown ups in their lives. This builds empathy, a crucial life skill.

Becoming comfortable with their feelings is important as children face new challenges and learn to manage their changing emotions.

There are simple things you can do at home to help your child learn more about emotions. Try some of these ideas:

- Ask your child how he/she is feeling. List some feeling words to chose from.
- Share how you are feeling. Be specific.
- Read stories with your child and talk about how the characters are feeling.
