Public Content

Background Information:

The School District, through an agreement with Cenergistic - The Energy Conservation Company, implemented an Energy Conservation Program in 2008. Principals, Maintenance Coordinators, and the District Energy Manager work together to monitor and conserve energy consumption at each school site and facility. Quarterly Energy Conservation Program Status Reports have been presented to the School Board since April 2009.

The December 2019 Energy Conservation Program Quarterly Status Report summarizes the performance results of the Energy Conservation Program for the quarterly period of July 2019 - September 2019. The report reveals data on energy consumption by the District during this period. Also provided is cost avoidance data for each district facility. The information is presented to show actual energy consumed and cost avoidance to the District as a result of the implementation of energy conservation strategies.

Educational Impact:

The program is intended to reduce operational costs related to utilities, therefore increasing dollars available for other District related operational expenses.

Strategic Plan Impact:

Supports the District's Mission by providing appropriate facilities to help inspire good character and a passion for life long learning in all students, creating educated and caring contributors to the world.

Fiscal Impact:

During the quarterly period July 2019 - September 2019 the Energy Conservation Program has resulted in additional costs avoidance for the School District of \$1,149,256. The current

rate of energy savings significantly exceeds the projected performance of the program. Since inception, the District has realized a total cumulative cost avoidance of \$54,710,381.

ENERGY CONSERVATION PROGRAM QUARTERLY STATUS REPORT July 2019 – September 2019

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The December 2019 Energy Conservation Program Quarterly Status Report summarizes the performance results for the quarterly period of July 2019 – September 2019 and is comprised of the following:

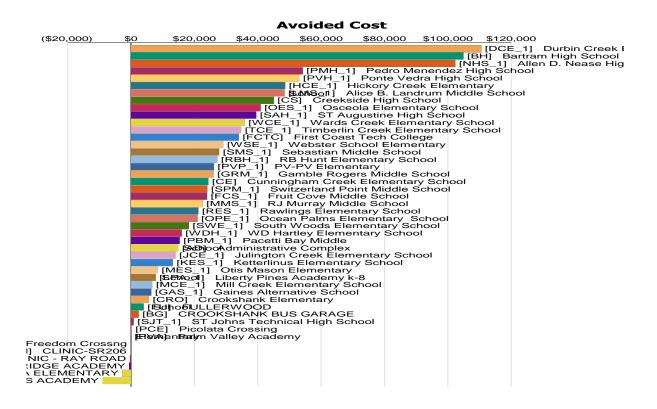
- Cost Avoidance Summary by Site (July 2019 September 2019): The District realized a total cost avoidance for this quarterly period of \$1,149,256 (or a 41.8% cost avoidance from the baseline period).
- Greenhouse Gas Reduction: Greenhouse Gas Reduction for this quarterly period reduced CO² by 5,813 metric tons.
- Year to Date Monthly Cost Avoidance Summary (January 2019 September 2019): This reflects the monthly summary of total cost avoidance for the period January 2019 September 2019.
- Energy Consumption Summary (Cumulative Year to date): Summary breakdown for electricity, water & sewer, and irrigation for January 2019 September 2019.
- Total cost avoidance for the district from program inception (July 2008 September 2019): This reflects the total cost avoidance since the implementation of the program. <u>Total</u> <u>cumulative cost avoidance of \$54,710,381.</u>

During the period of July 2019 – September 2019 there were 125 energy audits performed at District facilities. The results of these audits demonstrate continued efforts by employees to reduce energy use.

Our district continues to show a high regard in reducing the overall energy consumption. Many thanks to principals and our facilities staff district-wide for a very successful summer energy savings program.

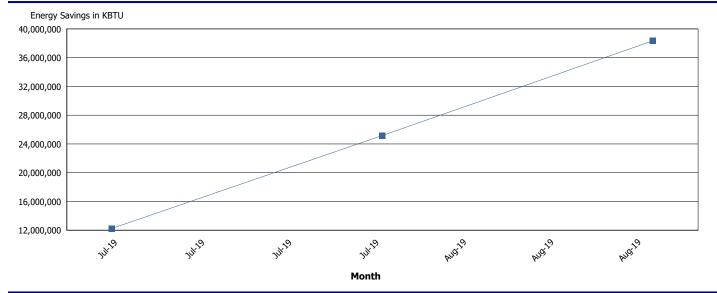
