Public Content

Background Information:

The School District, through an agreement with Cenergistic - The Energy Conservation Company, implemented an Energy Conservation Program in 2008. Principals, Maintenance Coordinators, and the District Energy Manager work together to monitor and conserve energy consumption at each school site and facility. Quarterly Energy Conservation Program Status Reports have been presented to the School Board since April 2009.

The September 2020 Energy Conservation Program Quarterly Status Report summarizes the performance results of the Energy Conservation Program for the quarterly period of April 2020 – June 2020. The report reveals data on energy consumption by the District during this period. Also provided is cost avoidance data for each district facility. The information is presented to show actual energy consumed and cost avoidance to the District as a result of the implementation of energy conservation strategies.

A revised Executive Summary for the 1st Quarter (January 2020-March 2020) has been added as backup to this report. This revised summary replaces the previous Quarterly Report information reported to the Board in June 2020. The revisions reflect several changes to data from which these reports are generated. These changes include water bills that were corrected after the original 1st Quarter Executive Summary was generated, as well as credits from FPL.

Educational Impact:

The program is intended to reduce operational costs related to utilities, therefore increasing funds available for other District related operational expenses.

Strategic Plan Impact:

Supports the District's Mission by providing appropriate facilities to help inspire good character and a passion for life long learning in all students, creating educated and caring contributors to the world.

Fiscal Impact:

During the quarterly period April 2020 - June 2020 the Energy Conservation Program has resulted

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in additional energy cost avoidance for the School District of \$1,440,659. The current rate of energy savings significantly exceeds the projected performance of the program. Since inception, the District has realized a total cumulative cost avoidance of \$59,750,651.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The September 2020 Energy Conservation Program Quarterly Status Report summarizes the performance results for the quarterly period of April 2020 – June 2020 and is comprised of the following:

- Electric Cost Avoidance Summary by Building (April 2020 June 2020): The District realized a total electric cost avoidance for this quarterly period of \$1,440,659 (or a 64.5% cost avoidance from the baseline period).
- Greenhouse Gas Reduction: Greenhouse Gas Reduction for this quarterly period reduced CO² by 7,782 metric tons.
- Year to Date Monthly Cost Avoidance Summary (January 2020 June 2020): This reflects the monthly summary of total cost avoidance for the period January 2020 June 2020.
- Energy/Utilities Consumption Summary (2nd Quarter): Summary breakdown for electricity, water and sewer for April 2020 June 2020. The District realized a total water cost avoidance for this quarterly period of \$156,769.
- Total Cost Avoidance for the district from program inception (July 2008 June 2020): This reflects the total cost avoidance since the implementation of the program. <u>Total cumulative cost avoidance of \$59,750,651.</u>
- A Revised Executive Summary for the 1st Quarter (Jan 2020-March 2020) has been added for information purposes. - Greenhouse Gas Reduction: Greenhouse Gas Reduction for this quarterly period reduced CO² by 5,844 metric tons.
- Year to Date Monthly Cost Avoidance Summary (January 2020 March 2020): This reflects the monthly summary of total cost avoidance for the period January 2020 March 2020.
- Energy Consumption Summary (Cumulative Year to date): Summary breakdown for electricity, water & sewer, and irrigation for January 2020 March 2020.
- Total cost avoidance for the district from program inception (July 2008 March 2020): This reflects the total cost avoidance since the implementation of the program. <u>Total cumulative cost avoidance of \$58,153,224.</u>



Expected Energy Cost

Anticipated expense without energy management.

Base year usage after adjustments for such variables as changes in weather, equipment, schedules, occupancy and prices.

Actual Energy Cost

Actual utility costs for electricity, gas, water, sewer, etc. obtained directly from bills.


Other Savings

Additional documented savings attributable to Program activities but not the direct result of usage reductions, such as rebates, refunds, tariff changes, etc.

Program Savings

The difference between Expected and Actual Cost, calculated in accordance with the International Performance Measurement & Verification Protocol. Does not include savings attributable to reduced equipment maintenance and replacement costs and other collateral benefits. These savings can increase the program savings up to 20%.
