Public Content

Background Information:

The School District, through an agreement with Cenergistic - The Energy Conservation Company, implemented an Energy Conservation Program in 2008. Principals, Maintenance Coordinators, and the District Energy Manager work together to monitor and conserve energy consumption at each school site and facility. Quarterly Energy Conservation Program Status Reports have been presented to the School Board since April 2009.

The June 2021 Energy Conservation Program Quarterly Status Report summarizes the performance results of the Energy Conservation Program for the quarterly period of January 2021 – March 2021. The report reveals data on energy consumption by the District during this period. Also provided is cost avoidance data for each district facility. The information is presented to show actual energy consumed and cost avoidance to the District as a result of the implementation of energy conservation strategies.

Educational Impact:

The program is intended to reduce operational costs related to utilities, therefore increasing dollars available for other District related operational expenses.

Strategic Plan Impact:

Supports the District's Mission by providing appropriate facilities to help inspire good character and a passion for lifelong learning in all students, creating educated and caring contributors to the world.

Fiscal Impact:

During the quarterly period January 2021 - March 2021 the Energy Conservation Program has resulted in additional energy cost avoidance for the School District of \$1,082,731. The current rate of energy savings significantly exceeds the projected performance of the program. Since inception, the District has realized a total cumulative cost avoidance of \$60,362,973.

ENERGY CONSERVATION PROGRAM QUARTERLY STATUS REPORT January 2021 – March 2021

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The March 2021 Energy Conservation Program Quarterly Status Report summarizes the performance results for the quarterly period of January 2021 – March 2021 and is comprised of the following:

- Electric Cost Avoidance Summary by Building (1st Quarter 2021): The District realized a total electric cost avoidance for this quarterly period of \$1,082,731 (or a 42.2% cost avoidance from the baseline period).
- 1st Quarter Electric Cost Savings Summary (1st Quarter 2021): This reflects the monthly summary of total electric cost avoidance for the period January 2021 March 2021.
- Greenhouse Gas Reduction: Greenhouse Gas Emissions Equivalent for this quarterly period reduced CO² by 5,058 metric tons.
- YTD Monthly Utilities Cost Avoidance (through 1st Quarter 2021): This reflects the monthly summary of water, sewer and electric cost avoidance for the period January 2021 March 2021.
- Energy/Utilities Consumption YTD Summary: Summary breakdown for electricity, water and sewer for January 2021 March 2021 period. For all tracked utilities, the District realized a total cost avoidance for this year of \$1,119,959
- Total Cost Avoidance Summary by Commodity (July 2008 March 2021): This reflects the total cost avoidance since the implementation of the program. <u>Total cumulative cost avoidance of \$60,362,973.</u>

During the period of January 2021 – March 2021 there were over 120 energy audits performed at District facilities. The results of these audits demonstrate continued efforts by employees to reduce energy use.

Our district continues to show a high regard for good stewardship and reducing the overall energy consumption. Many thanks to principals, school site managers and our facilities staff district-wide for a very successful first quarter of 2021.


