

Requirements

- Needs-based on Transition IEP Team decision (a Life Work representative must attend).
- Students must demonstrate a need for structured services/supports offered within the community.
- Students must have the desire and capacity to work given support in the community setting with minimal supervision.
- The student must be a client of Vocational Rehabilitation.
- Students must be under the age of 22.

Life Work students also have the opportunity to participate in Dual Enrollment classes at St. Johns River State College:



Traditional Dual Enrollment

- Traditional Dual Enrollment is a program that allows eligible high school students to earn college credit. Students enrolled in traditional dual enrollment will select their classes.
- Participation in Dual Enrollment in Florida requires a minimum of a 3.0 unweighted high school GPA.
- This program is designed for students who wish to transfer to a university to earn a baccalaureate degree.
- The Associate in Arts degree is the legally recognized transfer degree for the Florida College System and is specifically designed for the student who wishes to transfer into the State University System of Florida as a Junior.
- Although there are no "majors" in the Associate in Arts degree, with proper planning of coursework, students can complete the A.A. degree and transferspecific courses necessary for admission to a variety of degree programs within the State University System.
