Florida Students

The following are critical resources for planning your financial future:

- <u>FAFSA.GOV</u> Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to apply for federal student aid such as federal grants, work-study, and loans. Completing and submitting the FASFA is free and easy. FASFA gives you access to the largest source of financial aid to pay for college or career. Current high school seniors can apply as early as October 1, 2018.
- <u>FAFSA4Caster</u> FAFSA4Caster will help you understand your options for paying for college.
 FAFSA4Caster provides some basic information and will estimate your eligibility for federal student aid.
- <u>FloridaStudentFinancialAid.org</u> The Florida Department of Education (FDOE), Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA), administers a variety of state-funded scholarship and grant programs to assist Florida residents with the cost of their postsecondary education. Current high school seniors may complete the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) as early as October 1, 2018.
- <u>Collegescorecard.ed.gov</u> CollegeScoreCard will compare colleges using the College Scorecard.
