Dual Enrollment is an acceleration option

There are several acceleration options that secondary students can take advantage of to accelerate their high school standing and/or time in college. Some common acceleration options include:

- Advanced Placement (AP)
- Advanced Intenational Certificate of Education (AICE)
- Dual Enrollment (DE)
- Industry Certification (IC)
- International Bachelorette (IB)

<u>Acceleration benefits include</u>- weighted GPA, academic confidence and exposure to increased rigor, accelerated timeline for college graduation, career readiness, and/or advanced college standing.

Dual enrollment, or DE, allows secondary students in the State of Florida, to take postsecondary courses and earn college credits while also completing required high school courses.

There are several Florida statutes that govern dual enrollment policies. These statutes ensure consistency across all districts throughout the state.

Am I eligible for dual enrollment?



Standing/ Grade Level

All secondary students in the State of Florida are eligible to DE.



GPA

A student must have an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher for academic DE and a 2.0 unweighted GPA or higher for career DE at the time of application.



Test Scores

Demonstrate readiness by taking a college placement test like SAT, ACT, PERT, CLT, CASAS or other approved exams.

Emphasis on academic goals:

Earn both high school and college credits while taking courses through SJRSC.

College credits can be transferred to other post secondary institutions, per credit transfer policies and/or FL credit by exam agreement.

Associate in Art (AA) degree (60 college credits) is a strong foundation for a Bachelor's Degree.

- Self-Motivated
- Managing/balancing time
- ☐ Communicate with college advisors
- ☐ Be knowledgeable of transferability
- Must self-identify with the Office of Disabilities
- ☐ Be responsible for your college transcript
 - it starts with DE



What parents/guardians need to

know

- □ Due to FERPA, parents/guardians do not have access to student's information (grades, schedules, assignments, etc.) Parents should not email professors. Emails must come from the student and their Viking email.
- College coursework is an official record that will be on a student's permanent transcript
- College advisors are available, but your child must initiate communication





DUAL ENROLLMENT TEXTBOOKS





When requesting your textbooks

Use SJCSD credentials to request texbooks

Example:

Username: s123456@stjohns.k12.fl.us Password: dualenrollmentstudent1

Important Tips:

- Upload an Official college schedule
- College schedule must have Full Name, College ID(x- number), and course information
- All information must be visible on the uploaded document for request to be processed
- You will receive an email at the email address you provided when your materials are available for pick up
- For summer courses, pick up materials directly from the college bookstore.

Applying to St. Johns River State College (SJRSC)

1. Complete an on-line admission application form, found at:

https://web.sjrstate.edu/pls/prod/bwskalog.P_DispLoginNon?wapp=D1

- An 'X' number will be generated upon completion.
- 2. Complete a paper Consent form for participation and submit it with an official copy of a qualifying test score to your high school counselor.

 (Parent/guardian must sign this form).

SJRSC NEXT STEPS

- Once accepted, check the on-line course catalog for course availability options
- Meet with your HS counselor to submit a paper SJRSC course request which will be sent to SJRSC for processing
 - Set-up your SJRSC Viking e-mail
 - Complete New Student Orientation Online in Canvas
 - Check and re-check your concise schedule
 - Pick-up textbooks following the St. Johns County Schools textbook process.

 (Note: This process does **not** apply to DE students who are taking a DE course on their high school campus with a high school teacher)

SJRSC dual enrolment mode options

IN-PERSON

- * Take in-person DE courses at your high school campus with a HS teacher who is credentialed through SJRSC.
- * Go to SJRSC and take in-person classes (day or evening)



VIRTUAL

- * Take virtual DE courses in a lab on your high school campus during your school day, if space allows.
- * Take DE courses in the evening from home using your personal Internet/computer.
