# Word Gap—Why Talking Matters

Children from low-income families hear approximately 600 words every hour, whereas children from higher-income families hear 2,000 words an hour. Throughout the course of three years, this accumulates into a 30 million word gap between low income children and children from higher-income families. Children who have heard fewer words since birth, are likely to know fewer words and have a less diverse vocabulary. Language nutrition is healthy in any language! Talk with your child in the language you are most comfortable speaking. Read and tell stories in your home language. .
