

Commonly used vocabulary: Brick and Mortar - Teaching and learning occur on the school campus. **Grades Prek – 5 Elementary Cohort** - There is limited interaction between students from different classrooms. **A/B Secondary Student Grades 6-12 - Schedule** - The student population will be divided into two alphabetical groups. **Group A** attends Mondays & Thursdays. **Group B** attends Tuesdays & Fridays. All students are distance learners on Wednesdays. Teachers will work on campus everyday with partial student groups. Teachers are available to students on Wednesdays for distance learning support. The master schedule remains in place. **Distance Learning** - Short-term option. Online teaching mirrors the pace and rigor of brick and mortar. Students remain attached to the current school. **St. Johns Virtual School** - A fulltime virtual school allowing flexibility with pace. The curriculum maps (order and pace) do not align to brick and mortar. Students withdraw from the current school. **Pivot** - The model will be flexible to pivot depending on the status of the virus in our community. We will be prepared to shift from everyday brick & mortar to the A/B schedule to fulltime distance learning. The master schedule remains in place regardless of the option underway.

In the green section of the chart (low/no spread), all students would be attending school Monday-Friday. If the number of cases increases and there is the need to move into the tan/yellow section (minimal/moderate spread), elementary students will continue to go to school each day and will stay in their classroom (cohort) with little interaction with other students. Secondary students will shift to an A/B schedule with half of the students in school Monday & Thursday, and the other half of the students in school Tuesday & Friday. Wednesday will be a distance learning day for all students. Students will work independently on days at home with the teacher being available on Wednesdays; the A/B schedule is ONLY for secondary students in the event of an increased spread.
