STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES (SWD) GROWTH

Measurable Outcome: Increase English Language Arts (ELA) proficiency for Students with Disabilities (SWD) in grades 3-5 from 37% to at least 51%.

Action Steps:

- Use weekly PLCs to analyze student data, with a focus on SWD progress.
- Align IEP goals with B.E.S.T. Standards using ELA curriculum and iXL.
- Monitor student progress and support effectiveness weekly through ESE and administrative teams.



ELA INSTRUCTION & LEARNING GAINS (3-5)

Measurable Outcome: Increase ELA achievement from 65% to 67%, learning gains from 54% to 65%, and L25 learning gains from 52% to 62%.

Action Steps:

- Use weekly PLCs to analyze data, monitor L25 progress, and adjust instructional groups
- Provide standards-aligned instruction and differentiated small-group intervention.
- Monitor intervention outcomes weekly through CORE/MTSS meetings.



MATHEMATICS PROFICIENCY & LEARNING GAINS

Measurable Outcome: Increase Math proficiency from 67% to 70%, learning gains from 59% to 62%, and L25 gains from 38% to 60%.

Action Steps:

- Use weekly Math PLCs to analyze data and adjust instruction.
- Provide differentiated small-group instruction targeting priority math skills.
- Use iXL and intervention resources to address foundational skill gaps.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM

Measurable Outcome: Increase average daily attendance from 92.6% to 95.6% and reduce chronic absenteeism from 17.23%.

Action Steps:

- Review attendance data weekly to identify and support at-risk students.
- Use proactive family communication and personalized attendance interventions.
- Reinforce consistent attendance through PBIS incentives and recognition.

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CELEBRATIONS & SUCCESSES

Highlight key achievements, recognitions, programs, and milestones.

- 92% classroom teacher retention
- STAR & FAST Reading achievement increase in 4 of 6 grades.
- STAR & FAST Math achievement increase in 4 of 6 grades.
- Parent involvement and family participation in both academic and extracurricular activities continue to increase.
- Accelerated Reader & Book Vending Machine has increased the number of books in students' hands.
- This summer, teacher capacity and collegiality was built through participation in the district PLC conference, ensuring alignment with our school improvement priorities.
