SIP AREAS OF FOCUS



STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES (SWD) GROWTH

Measurable Outcome: Increase SWD ELA proficiency from 50% to 60%, with at least 70% demonstrating adequate growth by Spring 2027.

Action Steps:

- Use assessment data to identify literacy gaps and target SWD interventions.
- Provide explicit reading instruction in vocabulary, comprehension, fluency, and writing.
- Deliver evidence-based small-group interventions and review progress quarterly.



ELA PROFICIENCY & LEARNING GAINS

Measurable Outcome: Increase FAST ELA proficiency to 82% and ELA learning gains from 72% to 77%.

Action Steps:

- Use assessment data to create flexible groups and identify student needs.
- Provide daily differentiated ELA instruction with targeted scaffolds.
- Deliver small-group WIN interventions and monitor progress through regular PLC data reviews.



POSITIVE CULTURE & ATTENDANCE (PBIS)

Measurable Outcome: Reduce chronic absenteeism by 20%, decreasing chronically absent students from 90 to 72 or fewer.

Action Steps:

- Review attendance monthly to identify students needing early intervention.
- Reinforce attendance through PBIS recognition and celebrations.
- Provide family outreach and mentoring for students with attendance concerns.
