INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICE (ELA)

Measurable Outcome: Increase FAST ELA achievement to 84% overall, 51% for SWD, and 40% for ELL students.

Action Steps:

- PLC teams will meet once a week to reflect on effectiveness of strategies and review PM 1 and 2 data, common formatives and common summatives.
- Professional learning opportunities will be provided by instructional literacy coach on the PLC process, reviewing data and planning targeted instruction.



INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICE (MATH)

Measurable Outcome: Increase FAST Math achievement to 88% overall and 79% in Grade 8, with SWD Learning Gains reaching 58% and ELL achievement reaching 69%.

Action Steps:

- PLC teams will plan, and review data to reflect on effectiveness of strategies using PM 1 and 2 data, common formatives and common summatives.
- Professional learning opportunities provided by instructional literacy coach and math coach on reviewing data and planning targeted instruction.



INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICE (SCIENCE)

Measurable Outcome: Increase Science achievement from 81% to 83%.

Action Steps:

- PLC teams will plan, and review data to reflect on effectiveness of strategies.
- Professional learning opportunities will be provided by instructional literacy coach on the PLC process.

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MIDDLE SCHOOL ACCELERATION

Measurable Outcome: Increase FCMS Middle School Acceleration from 83% to 90% this school year.

Action Steps:

- Guidance counselors and administration will review student placement when scheduling new students.
- Inform teachers about course recommendations criteria in the spring and review placements after PM 3 progress monitoring when scheduling students for next year.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Measurable Outcome: Increase overall attendance by 3% and reduce chronic absenteeism from 13% to 10%.

Action Steps:

- Use PBIS rewards to recognize and reinforce positive attendance.
- Review EWS data and provide targeted student and family support.
- Implement behavior contracts linking attendance to participation in school activities
