SIP AREAS OF FOCUS



ELA LOWEST QUARTILE & SWD LEARNING GAINS

Measurable Outcome: Increase ELA Learning Gains for Lowest Quartile students by at least 3 percentage points, from 56% to 59% or higher.

Action Steps:

- Use assessment data to identify literacy gaps and target SWD interventions.
- Provide explicit reading instruction in vocabulary, comprehension, fluency, and writing.
- Deliver evidence-based small-group interventions and review progress quarterly.



ELA ENRICHMENT & HIGH PERFORMING GAINS

Measurable Outcome: Increase overall ELA Learning Gains by 3 percentage points to 71% through targeted rigor and enrichment for Level 4-5 students during WIN groups.

Action Steps:

- Provide dedicated WIN blocks for targeted intervention/enrichment.
- Use PLCs to group students based on specific reading skill needs.
- Monitor progress regularly and adjust Tier 1/2 reading instruction.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & PBIS

Measurable Outcome: Achieve 100% instructional and 75% non-instructional staff participation in positive referral systems to help reduce chronic absenteeism.

Action Steps:

- Use QR codes to streamline positive student and class referrals.
- Review referral data monthly and recognize selected students.
- Celebrate positive behavior through classroom visits and rewards.



CELEBRATIONS & SUCCESSES

Highlight key achievements, recognitions, programs, and milestones.

- Increased math learning gains of lowest quartile by 5% points.
- Increased to 80% ELA and 85 % math proficiency overall.
- Schoolwide implementation of WIN time (intervention and enrichment block) based on PLC data discussions.
