SIP AREAS OF FOCUS



BENCHMARK-ALIGNED INSTRUCTION

Measurable Outcome: Achieve 80%+ proficiency in ELA, Math, and Science, 70%+ learning gains, and improve SWD performance above state and district averages.

Action Steps:

- Plan standards-aligned, engaging instruction through PLC collaboration.
- Use common assessment data and observations to guide instructional adjustments.
- Provide targeted Intensive Reading based on specific student needs.



MIDDLE SCHOOL ACCELERATION

Measurable Outcome: Accelerate all eligible Level 4+ students and maintain an acceleration rate of 83% or higher.

Action Steps:

- Automatically place Level 4–5 students in accelerated math.
- Offer summer bridgework for eligible students seeking advancement.
- Monitor performance data to provide targeted support or additional acceleration.



STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES (SWD) GROWTH

Measurable Outcome: Close SWD learning gaps to exceed state and district proficiency averages in ELA and Math.

Action Steps:

- Identify and monitor L25 students with a focus on SWD.
- Collaborate on targeted small-group interventions to close achievement gaps.
- Support inclusive instruction through strategic scheduling and administrative walkthroughs.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & POSITIVE CULTURE

Measurable Outcome: Reduce chronic absenteeism by 10% and improve overall student attendance by 3% across all grade levels.

Action Steps:

- Reinforce character through monthly lessons and "The TIGER Way" PBIS expectations.
- Monitor attendance and truancy through MTSS and EWS data.
- Recognize student success through PBIS celebrations, rewards, and incentives.
