SIP AREAS OF FOCUS



INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICE (ELA, MATH & SCIENCE)

Measurable Outcome: Increase achievement by 2% across all ELA and Math grade levels, with Grade 5 Science increasing from 59% to 61%.

Action Steps:

- Provide targeted GROW small-group ELA/Math instruction.
- Use weekly PLCs to analyze data and adjust instruction.
- Reinforce science/math standards through weekly STEM classes.
- Utilize ILC & Math Coaches for targeted instructional support.



ESSA SUBGROUP GROWTH (SWD & BLACK STUDENTS)

Measurable Outcome: Increase Black student achievement to 56% in ELA and 50% in Math, and SWD achievement to 53% in both ELA and Math.

Action Steps:

- Use FAST data to identify Black and SWD students needing targeted support.
- Provide explicit ELA and Math small-group intervention during GROW.
- Monitor subgroup progress weekly through PLC data reviews.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & POSITIVE CULTURE (PBIS)

Measurable Outcome: Reduce chronic absenteeism by 20%, decreasing the number of students from 107 to 86 or fewer.

Action Steps:

- Review attendance weekly and assign case managers to at-risk students.
- Provide daily Character Counts and PBIS lessons.
- Reinforce positive behavior through schoolwide PBIS recognition and rewards.
