SIP AREAS OF FOCUS



MATHEMATICS PROFICIENCY & LEARNING GAINS

Measurable Outcome: Increase Math Learning Gains to 70%+, Lowest 25% Gains to 60%+, and overall Math Achievement to 77%+, with targeted growth across all grade levels.

Action Steps:

- Use weekly PLC data analysis to identify priority Math skills and intervention needs.
- Maximize WIN blocks for targeted small-group reteaching and immediate feedback.
- Partner with district specialists to strengthen data analysis, student grouping, and Math instruction.



ELA PROFICIENCY & GROWTH

Measurable Outcome: Increase ELA Achievement to 76%+, ELA Learning Gains toward 72%, and ELA Lowest 25% Gains toward 65% across Grades K-5.

Action Steps:

- Deliver explicit, systematic literacy instruction using the core ELA curriculum.
- Use PLC data analysis to identify standards and create flexible student groups.
- Provide targeted tutoring and reading intervention during WIN blocks.



SCIENCE INSTRUCTION & PROFICIENCY

Measurable Outcome: Increase Grade 5 Science proficiency from 63% to at least 66% on state assessments.

Action Steps:

- Analyze Science data to identify priority standards and skill gaps.
- Integrate vocabulary, hands-on investigations, and evidence-based writing.
- Use CSA data to monitor mastery and provide timely reteaching.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & TRUANCY INTERVENTION

Measurable Outcome: Reduce chronic absenteeism from 17.8% to 15% or lower, with targeted attendance support for Grades 1-3.

Action Steps:

- Monitor attendance weekly to identify students needing early intervention.
- Provide proactive family outreach for students with 3-5 unexcused absences.
- Recognize improved and consistent attendance through positive schoolwide incentives.
