STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES (SWD) LEARNING GAINS

Measurable Outcome: Increase ELA and Math Learning Gains for SWD students in Grades 4–5 to at least 70% by Spring 2027.

Action Steps:

- Set individualized learning-gain targets for Grade 4–5 SWD students using prior FAST data.
- Use weekly Gen Ed/ESE PLCs to monitor progress and adjust instruction.
- Provide targeted small-group intervention using research-based resources.



PROFESSIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITIES

Measurable Outcome: Ensure 100% of collaborative teams meet weekly to analyze standards and assessment data and provide targeted intervention and enrichment.

Action Steps:

- Communicate and reinforce a clear vision for effective collaborative planning and high-functioning teams.
- Provide active administrative participation and monitoring during collaborative team meetings.
- Analyze common assessment data to group students and implement targeted interventions and enrichment.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & POSITIVE CULTURE

Measurable Outcome: Reduce chronic absenteeism from 3.09% (28 students) to 1.5% or less (approximately 12 students or fewer).

Action Steps:

- Review attendance bi-weekly to identify students needing early intervention.
- Use the 2x10 mentoring strategy to strengthen student connections and attendance.
- Provide families with consistent attendance information and resources.
