SIP AREAS OF FOCUS



STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES ACHIEVEMENT

Measurable Outcome: Increase SWD achievement by at least 2% in ELA, Math, and Grade 5 Science.

Action Steps:

- Align ESE scheduling and instruction with individual learning goals and state standards.
- Protect specialized service blocks while strengthening ESE/Gen Ed collaboration.
- Use weekly ESE PLTs to monitor data and adjust targeted interventions.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & PBIS (BEHAVIOR)

Measurable Outcome: Increase student attendance by 3%, reduce chronic absenteeism, and decrease ESE discipline referrals by 2%.

Action Steps:

- Reinforce S.H.I.N.E. expectations and relationship-building strategies schoolwide.
- Use SHINE rewards to recognize and reinforce positive student behavior.
- Monitor attendance quarterly and provide targeted family outreach for chronically absent students.



COHORT ACADEMIC PROFICIENCY (1ST & 4TH GRADE)

Measurable Outcome: Reverse proficiency declines in Grade 4 ELA/Math and Grade 1 Math through targeted instruction and attendance monitoring.

Action Steps:

- Use PLC data reviews to monitor progress and differentiate instruction.
- Provide coaching and targeted academic intervention support.
- Use mid-quarter checkpoints to identify and support at-risk students early.

WHAT MAKES OUR SCHOOL UNIQUE

SCIENCE PROFICIENCY & INSTRUCTION

Measurable Outcome: Maintain Science Achievement at 77%+ while increasing Grade 5 Science proficiency for SWD students.

Action Steps:

- Provide standards-aligned, hands-on Science instruction and vocabulary development.
- Use Grade 5 PLC data to identify and address Science skill gaps.
- Provide small-group push-in support for struggling readers and ESE students.



ESE LEARNING GAINS & LOWEST 25% FOCUS

Measurable Outcome: Sustain and build upon prior gains for Lowest 25% students in ELA (+19%) and Math (+5%).

Action Steps:

- Use diagnostic data to provide targeted daily intervention and extension.
- Use weekly ESE PLTs to monitor IEP goals and align instruction and accommodations.
- Strengthen Gen Ed/ESE collaboration to ensure accommodations are implemented consistently.



EARLY WARNING SYSTEM (EWS) INTERVENTIONS

Measurable Outcome: Reduce the number of K-5 students exhibiting two or more early warning indicators in attendance, achievement, or discipline.

Action Steps:

- Review EWS data monthly to identify at-risk students early.
- Provide bi-weekly check-ins to monitor academic and behavioral progress.
- Coordinate family, social-emotional, and academic supports for identified students.
