SIP AREAS OF FOCUS



STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES (SWD)

Measurable Outcome: Increase SWD overall performance from 48% to 56%, ELA Achievement from 29% to 41%, and Math Achievement from 26% to 41%.

Action Steps:

- Use PLC structures and TAC data to track SWD skill mastery.
- Review at-risk SWD students monthly to determine targeted supports.
- Provide remediation through Learning Lunch and Jacket Prep interventions.



MATH ACHIEVEMENT & LOWEST QUARTILE

Measurable Outcome: Increase schoolwide Math Achievement to 60%+ and Math Lowest 25% Learning Gains above 46%.

Action Steps:

- Use Math PLCs to analyze data, plan instruction, and implement high-impact strategies.
- Monitor assessment results collaboratively to adjust instruction.
- Provide targeted remediation for at-risk Lowest 25% Math students.



ELA PROFICIENCY & GROWTH

Measurable Outcome: Increase overall ELA proficiency from 73% to 75% on statewide assessments.

Action Steps:

- Use weekly ELA/IR PLCs to plan Tier 1 instruction and analyze data.
- Monitor student progress using FAST, district, and classroom assessments.
- Implement high-impact reading strategies focused on textual analysis and writing mechanics.

- First time in school history earning "A-Rating" in consecutive years.
- Highest school grade score in school history.

COLLEGE & CAREER ACCELERATION

Measurable Outcome: Increase the schoolwide college and career acceleration rate from 68% to 90%.

Action Steps:

- Use student data to identify and place students in appropriate accelerated courses.
- Expand AP, AICE, and CTE acceleration pathways.
- Use PLC collaboration to strengthen student success in accelerated coursework.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & PBIS

Measurable Outcome: Reduce the number of students on the truancy list with 15+ unexcused absences compared to prior years.

Action Steps:

- Use the 10 by 2 Strategy to build positive connections with at-risk students.
- Monitor attendance regularly to identify concerns early.
- Engage families and provide mentoring and targeted attendance supports.



POSITIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Measurable Outcome: Expand the "Total Yellow Jacket Experience" to strengthen student engagement, school connectedness, and positive behavior.

Action Steps:

- Integrate the SAHS Core 4 to strengthen instruction, collaboration, and student support.
- Use EWS data to coordinate targeted academic and behavioral interventions.
- Increase student engagement through athletics, academies, extracurriculars, and community partnerships.
