SIP AREAS OF FOCUS



MATHEMATICS INSTRUCTION (TIER 1 & FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT)

Measurable Outcome: Increase overall Math proficiency from 65% to 67%, with gains across Grades 6–8 on PM3.

Action Steps:

- Train teachers to develop and analyze CFAs using GradeCam.
- Use real-time data to guide co-teaching and small-group differentiation.
- Provide push-in Tier 1 and Tier 2 support through a math-certified tutor.



MIDDLE SCHOOL ACCELERATION

Measurable Outcome: Increase Middle School Acceleration participation and pass rate from 81% to 90% in 2026–27.

Action Steps:

- Use FAST and classroom data to identify students for math acceleration.
- Monitor accelerated student progress quarterly and adjust supports.
- Use conferences and interim reports to ensure continued success.



STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES (SWD) ACHIEVEMENT

Measurable Outcome: Close the SWD achievement gap by 5%, increasing ELA proficiency to 41% and Math to 35% by Spring 2027 PM3.

Action Steps:

- Provide co-teaching & support facilitation for SWD students in ELA/Math.
- Training in formative assessment, small-group instruction, & teacher clarity.
- Use weekly ESE/Gen Ed co-planning.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & SOARING CULTURE

Measurable Outcome: Reduce chronic absenteeism by 3% across Grades 6–8 during the 2026–27 school year.

Action Steps:

- Implement SOAR expectations through the schoolwide PBIS Rewards system.
- Review attendance weekly and provide counselor support for at-risk students.
- Reinforce on-time attendance through classroom commitments and family engagement.
