SIP AREAS OF FOCUS



INSTRUCTIONAL PRACTICE (ELA, MATH, SCIENCE)

Measurable Outcome: Increase FAST ELA proficiency from 79% to 81%, Math from 79% to 81%, Science from 70% to 72%, and Grade 3 ELA from 83% to 85%.

Action Steps:

- Use PLCs and SHINE Time to provide targeted intervention and enrichment.
- Analyze progress-monitoring data to address individual learning gaps.
- Use common assessment data to identify and share high-yield practices.



ESSA SUBGROUP GROWTH (SWD, FRL, ELL)

Measurable Outcome: Increase achievement for targeted ESSA subgroups to reach Level 3 or higher in reading, math, and science.

Action Steps:

- Use MTSS and PLCs to monitor progress and adjust targeted interventions.
- Address foundational skill gaps through collaborative, data-driven instruction.
- Monitor data to ensure equitable access and accelerated learning for ELL and SWD students.



STUDENT ATTENDANCE & POSITIVE CULTURE

Measurable Outcome: Increase overall daily student attendance by 3%, reduce chronic absenteeism, and enhance measures of school climate and connectedness.

Action Steps:

- Build belonging through PBIS, Social Contracts, and daily family time.
- Recognize positive character and growth mindset quarterly.
- Strengthen community and attendance through student celebrations and family events.



CELEBRATIONS & SUCCESSES
