- Maintaining and improving facilities like bathrooms and stairwells
- Quality and cost of school lunches
- College and career counseling needs to be stronger and more accessible to all students
- Perpetuation of separation of student groups by the school
- Disparities among school campuses with policies, facilities, programs, reputation, tardy policies, and bathroom policies
- Funding for fine and performing arts program inconsistent from school to school
